Billy Michael Honor is a public scholar and civic organizer whose progressive and compelling insights have made him a sought after speaker and social commentator. He currently serves as a Georgia based faith organizer mobilizing faith communities to break the chains of injustice through organized civic engagement. In this role Billy's innovative campaigns and activism have been celebrated and written about by many media outlets and recognized for being one of the promising contemporary movements of public faith witness.

In addition to organizing, Billy also travels extensively providing public scholarship on issues at the intersection of faith, racial justice, community organizing and politics. His writings and work have been featured and published in stories by numerous media outlets including the Huffington Post, USA Today, The Nation, Mother Jones, NPR and the Sarasota Report. Billy has also received several awards for his work in the community and public scholarship. Most recently, in recognition of his faith voter engagement organizing the Center for American Progress Faith Initiative named him one of the country's "leaders to watch" in 2020 and the Atlanta Magazine named Billy one of the 500 most powerful people in Atlanta for 2021. Billy has also served as an adjunct instructor at several colleges and universities and is a graduate of Emory University, the Interdenominational Theological Center and Beulah Heights Christian University.
